Any specific infection known to the farmer should be reported to all persons involved in handling the cattle and further precautions taken if required. Annual testing of the herd. Good standard of hygiene maintained. All employees are experienced in dealing with cattle and carrying out foot trimming. The crush is to be kept in a good condition and well maintained. The crush is to be purpose built with foot restraints, belly winches and adequate space. All milking personnel should wear sound Wellington boots with good tread. The crush area should be clean, clutter free and well maintained. All grinders must have guards in place and the condition of the grinding disc and knife blades should be checked before use. Appropriate PPE should be worn, including wrist guards, apron and eye protection when grinders are being used. COSHH assessments and data sheet to be available. Gloves to be worn when required.
